MEET YOUR NEW PATRONESS MRS MARGARET SATTLER:

Margaret's sister-in-law, Mrs Joyce Weldon, was a member of the Wandoan Show Society and encouraged her to enter the knitted garments that she had made in readiness for the arrival of the baby in the 1960 show. This is where Margaret's association as an exhibitor started. This year will be the 60th year that Margaret has entered her work in the Wandoan Show, entering her knitting and sewing, crochet and patchwork over these years, but she admits that she does not enter any cooking!

Margaret became a steward for the Knitting, Crochet and Sewing section in the Willacy Pavilion after Mrs Connie Welsh retired, holding this position for about 40 years, before she herself retired. A highly successful exhibitor, Margaret has also won prizes for her knitted baby garments at the Brisbane Ekka and was awarded Grand Champion prize for her patchwork at the Tully Show. Margaret has also supported the Miles, Taroom and Chinchilla Shows and the Toowoomba Royal Show with her handcraft entries, as well as supporting the Queensland Country Women's Association over the years.

Margaret's love of 'The Show' started when she lived in Brisbane and attended the Ekka on what was known as 'Ladies Day' and she would sit in the grandstand to watch the ring events and the woodshop. Today, Margaret's favourite part of the show is watching the ladies in the dressage ring and the beautiful horses prancing around. Her favourite food every year is some chips from the Lions Van.

If you visit Margaret at her home, she will be either in her sewing room creating another piece of hand work or watching the tennis or cricket on the television, depending on the season.

Margaret became Patroness of the Wandoan Show in 2020, after the passing of former Patron Mr Don Hoffmann. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 the show was cancelled for 2020, but all is on track for the 2021 show where Margaret is eagerly looking forward to performing her duties as Patroness.

GENERAL SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES

1. The attention of intending exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and to the Constitution and Rules of this Society, in addition to any Special Regulations which appear within this schedule.
2. Competitors shall deliver to the Secretary a detailed list of Exhibits they intend to enter for competition on or before the date in the Prize Schedule. Each article delivered is to be labelled.
3. Exhibits will be received as per Regulations in the Schedule.
4. No exhibitor will be allowed to remove, or in any way, interfere with any exhibit till AFTER 4.30 pm on the day of the Show.
5. Farm and Dairy Produce, Fancywork, Household, Horticulture, Fine Arts and Schoolwork Exhibits MUST be grown or made by the Exhibitor and an article can be exhibited in only one Class or Section.
6. Exhibitors may submit any number of entries in any Section and Class unless otherwise stated.
7. No persons shall act as Judge in any Class in which he is an exhibitor.
8. Decision of the Judges to be final, but in the case of a breach of rules, a protest in writing by the Exhibitor may be lodged with the Secretary NOT LATER THAN TWO HOURS after the decision of the Judges is made known, accompanied by a deposit of \$40, which will be forfeited if such protest be considered frivolous by the Committee whose decision shall be final.
9. Care will be taken of the Exhibits, but the Committee will NOT be responsible for losses, damage, mis-delivery or death of any exhibits at the Show.
10. The judges may award a Second or Third Prize instead of a First, or may withhold a prize altogether, when the Exhibit or Exhibits are not of sufficient merit; they shall state on Award Paper reason for doing so.
11. The name of an Exhibitor or an Exhibit MUST be covered till judging is completed.
12. Entry Fees as stated in the Prize Schedule MUST accompany Entry.
13. Entry Forms can be obtained from the Secretary
14. Stewards are to see that all Exhibits are LABELLED and that the Judges Award Papers correspond with the labels. They shall also supply Judges with Badges and afford them all information for the discharge of their duties.
15. The Society reserves the right to refuse to admit, or to remove any Exhibit, which there is any reason to suspect, is diseased or dangerous.
16. The Society will NOT be held responsible for any accident that may happen to any Exhibit at the Show, and it shall be a condition of Entry that each Exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from accidents.
17. All Pavilion Exhibits to be in all Pavilions by 9am on FRIDAY 09 APRIL 2021
18. Exhibitors of Livestock MUST make their own arrangements for feeding their stock. No stock will be allowed to leave the grounds before 4 pm without permission of the stewards.
19. If there should be any doubts as to the correctness of the declaration of any Exhibit, such Exhibitor shall NOT be entitled to any prizes, which may be awarded to him or her until the Committee has satisfactory proof that the declaration is correct. Any exhibitor having, in the opinion of the Committee, made a false declaration shall be subject to all or any of the following PENALTIES; forfeiture of prize, non-permission to exhibit again, expulsion from the Association.
20. The Committee will receive Exhibits not specified in the Schedule provided there be sufficient space, and Special Prizes will be awarded if the Judges consider the Exhibits be worthy of them.
21. Any person insulting or interfering with the Judges, Stewards, Competitors or Officers of the Association during the Show will be liable to removal from the ground and any Prizes awarded to such person may be forfeited.
22. Any exhibitor or attendant refusing to attach the Prize Card or ribbon to any exhibit or which a prize has been awarded and refusing to display the same during the hours of the Exhibition will, on proof thereof, to the Committee, be DISQUALIFIED from receiving all prizes awarded to such exhibit during the Show, and no

Exhibitor will be allowed to display any Prize Card or Ribbon in addition to those issued by the Society for the year.

23. Should any Exhibit having gained a Prize, be disqualified, the next on the list does NOT necessarily obtain the same Prize. The Committee, with or without the advice of the Judges, shall decide the matter.

24. All precautions will be taken to guard against fire or damage, and to protect the property of the Exhibitor, but Exhibits will NOT be insured by the Society.

25. Be sure to sign your entry.

26. Entries close as stated in schedule.

27. You acknowledge that it is a condition of acceptance of this nomination that neither the Wandoan Show Society Committee nor the Council of the Shire in which the Grounds is located will be responsible in respect of any injury, loss or damage personally or otherwise which may be suffered by you in consequence of or in any way arising out of your attendance at, or participating in the rodeo-campdraft-race meeting event and I agree for myself, my executors and administrators to indemnify the Committee and the Council and the members here of in respect of any such claims.

28. All ribbon winners in horse events and stud cattle sections are encouraged to participate in a grand parade if held.

29. Definition of "local" - All residents of former Taroom Shire.

30. All Dogs on Grounds at Showtime must be restrained at all times.

WANDOAN SHOW GROUNDS TICK STATUS:

**** DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE & FISHERIES ****

The Wandoan Memorial Grounds are situated within the Cattle Tick FREE Area.

All livestock entering these grounds are required to be free of cattle ticks and to have met the movement conditions of the Stock Act 1915 and Stock Regulations 1990.

The following conditions apply to the movement of stock from tick-infected areas to the Memorial Grounds.

A. HORSES REQUIRE ONE CLEAN SUPERVISED TREATMENT

B. CATTLE- refer to DAF cattle tick movement regulations. In certain cases, a pre-treatment declaration must accompany stock from infected areas when presented for clean inspection and treatment at a clearing facility.

1. **Stud Cattle** - Led Tractable and Groomed.

ONE SUPERVISED CLEAN TREATMENT

Movement to commence within 24 hours of the second treatment.

Spraying is acceptable for treatments.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Program Changes:

1. Please Note: The Wandoan Horse Show Program is subject to change. Please refer to the Wandoan Show Society Website: wandoanshow.com.au/schedules for the latest version closer to the date of competition. **It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure they have the most recent schedule copy.**

Chief Steward

2. The Chief Steward shall have the final say in all decisions regarding any event and entrance into events.
3. Any competitor or persons associated displaying disruptive or offensive behavior at the discretion of the Chief Steward will be asked to leave the grounds immediately and excluded from participating in any further events.

Horse and Rider Safety

4. The committee will not be responsible for any injury to stock, or damage to equipment or gear. Competitors ride at their own risk. Each competitor must acknowledge that it is a condition of acceptance of their nomination that the Wandoan Show Society Committee will not be responsible in any respect for injury, loss or damage, personally or otherwise which may be suffered by them in consequence of or in any way arising out of their attendance at or participation in the Show. He/she must agree for themselves, their executors and administrators to indemnify the Wandoan Show Society and its members in respect to any such claim.

Biosecurity

5. Wandoan Showgrounds are Biosecurity controlled.
6. All entries are required to conform to Biosecurity Regulations – **a Horse Health Declaration MUST accompany nominations and be handed in at the Secretary's Office prior to entering the ring.**
7. All horses must have their own individual water buckets for Biosecurity Regulations.

Nominations

8. Nominations will be by way of a ticket system. Tickets are available from Ring Secretary's Office before or during the show.
9. All nomination fees to be paid before competing in any event. Late entries will only be accepted at the discretion of the Ring Steward.
10. Competitors must hand nomination tickets to Ring Steward prior to entering the ring. Unused nomination tickets may be returned to Ring Secretary's Office for refund before the conclusion of ring events – providing they are not written on. No claims may be made after this time.
11. The Committee reserves the right to cancel any event or alter the conditions of entry to any event due to insufficient nomination.
12. All Competitors must present "Placing Tickets" to Ring Secretary's Office at end of each Class in order to collect prizemoney. **Prizemoney will not be awarded without placing tickets.**

Disputes or Protests

13. If you have a dispute or protest regarding judging, all disputes must be in writing and submitted to the Ring Secretary Office with a non-refundable deposit of \$100.00 within 30 minutes of the completion of the event in question. Disputes Committee's decision is final.

Marshalling

14. **Competitors are responsible for being ready for each scheduled event.**

Classifications and Definitions

15. Horse section competitors are **either a Hunter OR Hack for the duration of the Show**. Exceptions to this rule are for ridden classes and local competitors, where local competitors can compete in either the Open Hack Hunter sections of the Show and participate on a Hack OR Hunter classified horse for Local Classes.
16. Horse registration and society memberships- proof of current membership and horse registration papers must be presented on request for breed or society classes. All horses competing in the registered breed society classes must be registered and proof of registration may be requested. If a horse or a competitor is found competing in a class they do not hold a current registration for they will be asked to remove themselves from the class. Results will be forwarded onto the respective societies for checking of current memberships and registrations.

- 17. Maiden Events- Any entry that has not won a Hack Class in competition at an affiliated show
- 18. Novice Events - Any entry that has not won an Open Class at an affiliated show.
- 19. Intermediate Events – Any entry that has not placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd at any Royal Show
- 20. Open Events- Open to any horse or pony.
- 21. A "Lady" is deemed to be a female 17 years and over.
- 22. A "Gentleman" is deemed to be a male 17 years and over.

Measuring

- 23. Ponies, Galloways and Hacks **MUST BE MEASURED** and issued with a certificate of height by the Official Measurer who will be on the ground both days before 8.00am. Certificates must be produced in the ring if requested. (1/2 inch to be allowed for shoes on shod horses).
- 24. Height of a Pony - Up to and not exceeding 14 hands.
- 25. Height of a Galloway - Over 14 hands but not exceeding 15 hands.
- 26. Height of a Hack - over 15hh.

Local Events

- 27. Riders must be residents of the former Taroom Shire.
- 28. Horses to have been pastured within the former Taroom Shire not less than three months prior to show.
- 29. Local Champion Hack or Riders are **NOT** eligible for Supreme Champion Hack or Rider of the Show.

Stallions

- 30. No Stallions to be left unattended.

Showjumping

- 31. To be run under EA Showjumping rules.
- 32. Any horse, or horse and rider combination may **only** compete in a maximum of three events for the **day** of competition.
- 33. EA Approved helmets must be worn at all times of competition.
- 34. A competitor is eligible for junior jumping up to the year of their 18th birthday as per calendar year (up to 31st December 2021)
- 35. Please refer to EA rules for clarification or see ring committee member or ring steward if required

Helmet Standards

- 36. ALL Junior and Senior Competitors **MUST** wear an Equestrian Australia (EA) Approved Safety Helmet, at all times, whilst on any horse on the grounds, for the duration of the show. Including in the warm up, marshalling and during all classes.
***With the exception of Senior Riders ONLY in the following Classes*:**
- 37. Ridden Working Horse Classes (Classes 1013-1021).
- 38. Current EA Helmet Standards as at 1st January 2017:
- 39. **AS/NZS 3838** – Australian Standard **current** (2006 onwards) provided they are SAI Global marked.
- 40. **ARB HS 2012** – Australian Standard **new** provided they are SAI Global marked.
- 41. **ASTM F1163** – American Standard **current** (2004a or 04a onwards) provided they are SEI marked, or **SNELL E2001**.
- PAS 015** – British Standard **current** (1998 or 2011) provided they are BSI Kitemarked.
- 42. **VG1** – European Standard **interim** (01.040: 2014-12) with or without BSI Kitemark.

190g butter at room temperature, chopped
1 1/4 cups white sugar
3/4 cup milk
1 teaspoon vanilla essence
1 1/2 cups plain flour
3/4 cup corn flour
1 1/2 level teaspoon baking powder
pinch of salt
6 egg whites - at room temperature
1-2 drops rose-pink food colouring

Icing:

1 1/2 cups icing sugar
10g butter
2 tablespoons boiling water
few drops of rose-pink food colouring

Method:

- Preheat oven to slow - 150C. Grease and line the base of a 20cm round, deep cake tin.
- Cream the butter and sugar in the small bowl of an electric mixer until white and fluffy. Gradually add half the milk to help dissolve the sugar and beat well. Beat in the vanilla. Transfer to a larger bowl.
- Sift the flour, corn flour, baking powder and salt together three times. Fold into the butter mixture, then add the remaining milk. In another bowl, use clean beaters to beat the egg whites to stiff peaks. Fold half the egg whites into the cake batter, then fold in the remaining egg whites.
- Transfer 1 cup of the mixture to a smaller bowl and stir in the drops of food colouring. Take about 3/4 cup of the white mixture and spread over the base of the tin. Take half the pink batter and spoon it in a ring about 1 cm in from the edge of the tin - it should be about 1-1.5 cm wide.
- Very carefully spread half the remaining white batter over, taking care not to disturb the pink ring. Spoon the remaining pink batter into the center of the tin, making a round of 8 cm. Spoon the rest of the white batter over the whole top, again taking care not to disturb the round.
- Bake for about 70 minutes, until the cake is springy to a gentle touch in the center and comes away from the sides of the tin. It may appear slightly cracked in the center but should settle flat on cooking. Turn out onto a clean tea towel lined with a sheet of baking paper. Leave to cool.
- To make icing, combine the ingredients until smooth. Spread over the top of the cooled cake and leave to set. **Only ¼ required for judging**
