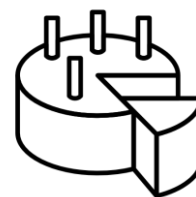

An imaginative creation in any shape and design formed from cake.

Class 8006 RICH FRUIT CAKE, 1/2lb (250g)

Fruit to be cut to about the size of currants. 20cm (8") square or round cake tin. To be made four weeks prior to show. **Only ¼ required for judging Winner invited to compete in SWQ Chamber Finals**

Class 8007 BOILED FRUIT CAKE, 1/2lb (250g)

Uncut fruit, no cherries, 20cm (8") square or round cake tin. **Only ¼ required for judging**

Class 8008 PUMPKIN FRUIT CAKE, 1/2lb (250g)

20cm (8") square or round cake tin. **Only ¼ required for judging**

Class 8009 SULTANA CAKE, 1/2lb (250g)

Mix to contain no more than 10-12oz sultanas. 20cm (8") square or round cake tin. **Only ¼ required for judging**

Class 8010 PLUM PUDDING, 1/2lb (250g)

Boiled in cloth **Only ¼ required for judging**

Class 8011 STEAMED PLUM PUDDING, 1/4lb (125g)

Steamed in basin. **Only ¼ required for judging**

Class 8012 DATE ROLL

To be baked in roll tin. **Only ¼ required for judging**

Class 8013 CHOCOLATE BUTTER CAKE

20cm (8") Round cake tin, plain chocolate icing on top only. Icing to be same colour as cake. **Only ¼ required for judging**

Class 8014 ORANGE BAR CAKE

To be baked in a bar tin, orange icing on top only. **Only ¼ required for judging**

Class 8015 CARROT & WALNUT CAKE

20cm (8") square or round cake tin. Iced on top with lemon icing. **Only ¼ required for judging**

Class 8016 BANANA CAKE

20cm (8") round cake tin. Iced on top with lemon icing. **Only ¼ required for judging**

Class 8017 SPONGE SANDWICH

Plain, baked in 20cm (8") round cake tins joined with fine line of jam. Top may be dusted with icing sugar. **Only ¼ required for judging**

Baked in bar tin, plain chocolate icing all over. Icing to be same colour as cake. **Only ¼ required for judging**

Entry Fee: \$1-50

Ingredients:

190g butter at room temperature, chopped
1 1/4 cups white sugar
3/4 cup milk
1 teaspoon vanilla essence
1 1/2 cups plain flour
3/4 cup corn flour
1 1/2 level teaspoon baking powder
pinch of salt
6 egg whites - at room temperature
1-2 drops rose-pink food colouring

Icing:

1 1/2 cups icing sugar
10g butter
2 tablespoons boiling water
few drops of rose-pink food colouring

Method:

- Preheat oven to slow - 150C. Grease and line the base of a 20cm round, deep cake tin.

- Cream the butter and sugar in the small bowl of an electric mixer until white and fluffy. Gradually add half the milk to help dissolve the sugar and beat well. Beat in the vanilla. Transfer to a larger bowl.
- Sift the flour, corn flour, baking powder and salt together three times. Fold into the butter mixture, then add the remaining milk. In another bowl, use clean beaters to beat the egg whites to stiff peaks. Fold half the egg whites into the cake batter, then fold in the remaining egg whites.
- Transfer 1 cup of the mixture to a smaller bowl and stir in the drops of food colouring. Take about 3/4 cup of the white mixture and spread over the base of the tin. Take half the pink batter and spoon it in a ring about 1 cm in from the edge of the tin - it should be about 1-1.5 cm wide.
- Very carefully spread half the remaining white batter over, taking care not to disturb the pink ring. Spoon the remaining pink batter into the center of the tin, making a round of 8 cm. Spoon the rest of the white batter over the whole top, again taking care not to disturb the round.
- Bake for about 70 minutes, until the cake is springy to a gentle touch in the center and comes away from the sides of the tin. It may appear slightly cracked in the center but should settle flat on cooking. Turn out onto a clean tea towel lined with a sheet of baking paper. Leave to cool.
- To make icing, combine the ingredients until smooth. Spread over the top of the cooled cake and leave to set. **Only ¼ required for judging**

To reduce wastage, for 2021, bottle sizes from 150gms – 300gms will be accepted. Chief Steward will further consider alternatives to minimize, or eliminate, wastage.

- One entry only per batch, per Class permitted.
- Bottle **MUST BE FILLED** to within 1.25 cm of top (half an inch).
- No paraffin wax to be used.
- **Bottles size from 150 gms**
- Screw or twist lids must be used.
- Lids are to be released before entering.
- Lids on bottles must be marked to correspond with entry numbers.
- Lids must be clean.
- Homemade sauce to be entered in tomato sauce bottles - 300ml only.
- Name the Jam.
- No cloth tops.

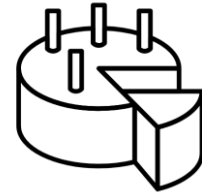
